From the Council:

Dear congregation,

As a part of how we deal with responsible institutional behavior during the coronavirus pandemic, we'd like to ask that no members of the congregation other than staff come into the church building without express notice or permission. We ask this based on directives and guidelines from both government and our denomination regarding how we think the virus spreads, the importance of social distancing, and quarantining ourselves for two weeks after we travel. We want to protect our staff by trying to ensure that the facility is as safe as we can make it. And because we plan to continue streaming worship services, a few people will need to feel they are coming to as safe a place as we can control in order to worship together-even virtually. We know that even healthy people can carry COVID 19. Many experts say we should behave as though everyone might be a carrier at this point to limit the spread.

The council has agreed that we should follow the guidelines available to us, so we ask for your support in this process. We want to be as responsible as we can with the information we have, even erring on the side of caution. We also know the Lord holds this and us in his hands. We pray for his grace and peace for you all.
