We can trust our Father to keep forgiving us and giving us new life. In that and other ways, our Father will give us forgiveness that we can share.



Dialogue on Prayer

Why does Jesus teach us to pray, "forgive us our debts?"

"Debts" is one way to talk about sin. Sometimes we do sinful actions,
and we can call those sins "trespasses." Other times we fail to do
something good—some action God wants us to do. We can call those sins

"debts."

How can we picture our Father forgiving our debts, our trespasses—all our sins? We can picture the father in Jesus' parable, who ran to hug his prodigal son. We can picture that forgiving father going to see the older brother, too, and wanting to forgive him too and give him new life. We can remember Jesus praying from the cross: "Father, forgive them because they don't know what they're doing."

What if we can't seem to forgive some people who hurt us?

Right; The Bible says that when we don't know how to pray, the Holy Spirit can pray in us and for us. So we can keep asking our Father to fill us with his Spirit and make us more and more like Jesus, including when we pray.
