- Prayer for World Hunger Sunday
Oh God, what love you have lavished on us that we can call ourselves your children. (1 John 3:1) We are no longer foreigners and strangers. We are fellow citizens with your people. We are members of your household. Your welcome is extravagant! (Ephesians 2:19)
