We hope you have the upcoming Bridge of Hope/Covenant Water Softener Salt Sale Fundraiser on your calendar! The plan is to have a family order sheet in your mail box this Sunday, February 28. Our goal is for each family to sell 25 bags of salt—this is more attainable for some of our congregation than others, so all we really ask is that you try to sell as much as you are able. Family, friends, and neighbors are all people you can contact about purchasing salt through our fundraiser. Be sure to mention that we deliver the salt

ourselves and put it wherever they would like! Order forms will be due March 14!

In the meantime we also need to begin finding people to drive trucks with trailers to deliver the salt. So if you have a truck or trailer and would be willing to drive your truck with a trailer attached or let us use your trailer with someone else's truck, please contact Emily Kramer or Jenni Mellema. Please note that a pallet of salt weighs 2,520 lbs and trailers should be able to comfortably hold this amount. Also keep your eyes peeled for a link to a sign up sheet for workers to help deliver salt on April 10.

Notes from the Deacons

At the February deacons meeting, I brought up a request to the deacons. One of our SAM committee members saw that the Maletoungou special fundraising goal for the Teacher's Garden has a ways to go yet before the end of the fiscal year on June 30 and asked if Covenant can help. The Christian Education Resource Center goal of \$30,000 had \$125 as of the January Newsletter.

The Maletoungous have been involved in building up a network of Christian Schools in West Africa and equipping teachers with resources and education. The Teacher's Garden has books and resources, but also organizes regular workshops and is a kind of community center for educators to give each other support in their work.

If you look back through the Maletoungous' newsletters in the eCoVenAnt emails and get

caught up, I think you'll see that the Teacher's Garden has been a great project for Sos and Kara to be involved with and there are many stories of how God is at work in their ministry.

The Deacons approved a special gift and we will finalize an amount in March. The SAM Committee has a special giving opportunity on the next fifth Sunday, but that will not be until May 31, so we didn't want to wait that long.

If necessary, some of the extra funds in May can supplement the budgeted Missions Fund, but if the missions fund giving stays steady, we will have another opportunity to come together in a special way on that fifth Sunday.

You can reach out to me if you see more needs that we can consider as a Service and Missions Committee as we get closer to May.
