The First Movement

John 9:1-12 p.1664

Jesus both confronts the assumptions of his disciples and heals a man born blind. His disciples assume that life's difficulties are a punishment of God - the same assumption made by Job's friends. Jesus challenges this assumption and promises to display who he is. The healing of this man's blindness, then, refocuses us on the identity of Jesus as God's Anointed One, the Messiah. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus continues to work in our lives and in our world. In this time of silence, reflect on the assumptions we make about the things happening in our life and world. How does the death and resurrection of Jesus reframe these events? How might these unexpected or unwanted events in our life be used for God's glory?

The amazing work of Jesus faces opposition from those who think they know better. The Pharisees are trapped in their way of thinking about the world. They cannot comprehend that the man's blindness was not somehow tied to sin. They cannot imagine that God could work through Jesus, this man who lives in a way that defies everything they thought they knew about the Law. Yet they are confronted with what should be an irrefutable fact: a man who was blind can now see. In this time of silence, reflect on the unexpected work of God. How has God worked in ways that surprised you? How do we respond when we come face to face with the work of God? Do we deny it, like the Pharisees, or do we celebrate it?
