## Cornbread, Christian Education, and Pork 'n' Bands!

#### An update from the deacons at Covenant CRC

First of all, I encourage you, church family, to uphold all of our students in prayer in the coming months and years. We celebrate our commitment to help raise our children to know and serve the Lord and we thank you for partnering with families to help support our youth whether they are learning at schools or homes, public or private. This year, our church has 52 students from Covenant learning in 4 local Christian Schools (39 at the elementary schools of SCCS and OCCS, and 13 in the high schools of Western and Unity). We also have a number of children in our church community learning in their homes and at Sioux Center Community Schools.

I wanted to share an update from the Deacons regarding our Christian education commitments for 2021-2022. Covenant church has pledged \$161,525 for the school year, which averages to \$13,460.42 per month. We are grateful for the many contributors in sharing this responsibility. If you have any questions, please ask Ruth Clark, Kurt Vos, or Kris Vander Plaats.

Next, we joined on Saturday, September 18, in the Fruited Plain parking lot to enjoy live music from some Covenant church members and various local bands, pulled pork sandwiches by pit-master Dave Kramer, and delectable desserts by many Covenant members. It was a joy to serve with one another and to raise some money for Christian education. We served approximately 270 people and we raised \$2250 from the evening! Thanks for participating (by attending, donating food, or volunteering) in our first fund-raiser of this school year.

Finally, do you know what goes well with pulled pork? This cornbread has been popular at a couple of Covenant potlucks and I thought I'd share the recipe (received from friends years ago):

Cast-iron Skillet Corn Bread (10" round skillet)

Dry ingredients (mix well): 1 cup flour 2/3 cup sugar

1 cup cornmeal mix (like boxed Jiffy cake)

1/2 Tbsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

Wet ingredients (mix well):

1 1/4 cup milk

2 eggs


1/3 cup canola oil

4 Tbsp. butter (melt in hot skillet, see below)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Put skillet in oven for about 8 minutes and add butter into skillet until melted (2-3 minutes). Mix dry and wet ingredients separately, then combine gently. Pour in half the melted butter from the skillet into the mixture, then pour all of the mixture into the hot skillet. Bake for 30 minutes, or until slight cracks appear on top and it turns a golden brown. Enjoy!

Note: I make 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  of this recipe for a large, 12" skillet.
