LEADER We light a third candle to acknowledge the pain of our loss in this Christmas season. We pause to remember the past weeks, months, and, for some of us, years of difficult times. In the poignancy of memories, we feel all the grief, the sadness, the hurts, and the fears, and we entrust them to Christ, the suffering servant who is victorious over death itself.

PEOPLE **We remember that the dawn overcomes the darkness.**

- 14 Why, Lord, do you reject me  
and hide your face from me?
- 15 From my youth I have suffered and been close to death;  
I have borne your terrors and am in despair.
- 16 Your wrath has swept over me;  
your terrors have destroyed me.
- 17 All day long they surround me like a flood;  
they have completely engulfed me.
- 18 You have taken from me friend and neighbor—  
darkness is my closest friend..
