new socks and underwear (children and adults)



# Notes from the Deacons

The Deacons have been working hard to serve the church in a number of ways over the last few months. We are exploring new ways to make giving your offering easier and more streamlined while maintaining a high level of stewardship with your gifts. We are making progress with the problem of what to do with replacing the old roof over the sanctuary and how that project affects other building projects needed in our worship space.

We have designated funds to assist our own missionaries, the Crulls, as they transition their family back to lowa. Their estimated moving cost have increased because of recent global inflation; as an example the shipping container that they had already filled and sent on its way with most of their belongings ended of costing \$2600 more than they were initially quoted and the cost of airline tickets increased. Here is Kelly and April Crull's latest newsletter with more information about how we can serve them as they transition back to the United States.

We have gathered so many incredible stories of God's provision for our family and ministry during out time in Spain. Our upcoming move to the US has been no exception. Thanks to many of you who have reached out to let us know you are praying for us and to offer help. Here's an update on how things are going.

#### HOW ARE WE DOING?

The first thing most people ask is, "How are you doing?" We knew moving a family of five and a dog to another continent would be a big undertaking, but we had no idea. (It's probably better we didn't know!) We've been busy with farewells, emptying our house, preparing a shipping container, and house hunting in Des Moines. Our official moving date is August 2nd.

We are finding time for our bucket list. Last weekend we visited cave paintings near our

house that we hadn't seen before. The kids have asked to keep their school and social schedules as normal as possible. Still, we are all dealing with high levels of stress and sadness about leaving mixed with excitement about our next adventure.

#### **HOW CAN YOU HELP?**

One-time Gifts: Our greatest need right now is one-time gifts to cover our moving costs, which include our flights (\$5,000), our shipment (\$6,500), furniture and other household items (\$5,000), and cars (\$15,000). Donate Household Items: Most of our belongings will stay in Spain because it's too expensive to ship them or they won't work in the US (like most electronic devices, for instance). Place to Land: If you've heard anything about the housing market right now, you know it's tricky. We're working with a real estate agent to buy our first home, but it won't be easy in our price range. Do you know anyone in the Des Moines area that might be able to offer us a place to stay while we're looking for a home?

**Prayer:** I'm sure you also have many stories of how God has provided what you needed at the

right time in a way that you never would have imagined and in a way only He could do. We already see God at work through this transition as we experience His care, the love of the church, new opportunities and friendships, and an invitation to trust in new ways.

Here are some specific prayer requests:

- Pray for our kids as they finish their last school year in Spain.
- Pray that we would finish well as we say goodbye to friends and colleagues, in particular at our mission organization's gathering in July.
- Pray for wisdom as we choose new schools for our kids.
- Pray for a new church home in Des Moines.
- Pray for a new home in Des Moines near schools and April's sister and her family. (Ruben is praying for his own bedroom!)
- Pray for financial provision to cover our moving costs.
- Pray for our staff and churches in Spain through this transition.
