Friday, April 28: At 7:30pm in the B.J. Haan Auditorium, the 4th Avenue Singers will present a concert in conjunction with the 4th Avenue Band and Jazz Combo. The concert will feature familiar jazz standards. The Band and Singers will join forces on settings of "Come Fly With Me," written for Frank Sinatra, and "Chattanooga Choo Choo," made famous by Glenn Miller and his orchestra in 1941. Saturday, April 29: MENDELSSOHN, SONGS & PSALMS - The Sioux County Oratorio Chorus, joined by Northwestern College's Heritage Singers, will be presenting a varied program of psalms, hymn, and sacred songs by Mendelssohn, Schütz, Thomson, Handel, and Duruflé at 7:30pm in B.J. Haan Auditorium at Dordt University. With guest conductor Michael Pekel, chamber orchestra, and soprano soloist Shannon Salyards, the choirs will bring vibrant settings of Psalms 90, 100, and 42, along with enduring favorites like Handel's "Zadok the Priest" and Duruflé's "Ubi caritas." Friday, May 5: At 7:30pm in the B.J. Haan Auditorium, the Dordt Music Department will present the Spring Choral Ensembles Concert. The music for this concert will explore the narrative arch of Creation, Fall, Redemption, Consummation, and the dichotomy between our earthly and heavenly homes. Music will range in style from spirituals and music based on Appalachian shape note singing to music from the cathedrals of Europe. A feature of the concert will be Arvo Part's rarely performed *Credo* for choir, orchestra, and piano. The concert will close with Eriks Esenvalds' triumphant "*Trinity*" *Te Deum* for choir, brass, percussion, and organ. As part of this concert, we will be honoring MaryLou Wielenga for her 45 years of faithful service to Dordt University through music. MaryLou will offer a prelude and offertory during the concert, and all are invited to a reception honoring her retirement following the choral concert in the lobby of the B.J. Haan Auditorium. Saturday, May 6: At 7:30pm in the B.J. Haan Auditorium, the Dordt Instrumental Ensembles will give their final concert of the semester. The concert will open with Campus-Community Band performing *Fanfare Prelude on God of our Fathers*, followed by Ralph Vaughan-Williams's *English Folk Song Suite*. The Chamber Orchestra will feature a new composition by Dordt music major Aaron Galloway entitled *Divertimento*. In addition, the orchestra will perform the first movement of Tchaikovsky's *Serenade for Strings*. Closing the concert, the Wind Symphony will feature senior pianist Anna Rediger on John Barnes Chance's *Introduction and Capriccio*, in addition to music by Bryant and Sorah, then closing the concert with John Mackey's masterpiece *The Frozen Cathedral* which features antiphonal percussion to include an instrument not seen often called the waterphone.
