
We're Workin' on a Building

On Tuesday evening, April 25, the council made this motion regarding building and sanctuary updates: "Proceed with the implementation phase of the roofing project and the design phase of the worship space, A/V, and lighting improvements guided by the concepts presented and budget estimates provided for our fundraising, financing, and planning."

Council president Duane Bajema and clerk Ethan Brue led us through a healthy dialogue that included the story of what brought us to this point, summaries of meetings with an architect, consultants, and various members of the congregation, and a breakdown of the financing needed for the project. The Service and Missions Committee is conducting a non-perishable food and household items drive for our local Mid-Sioux Opportunity, Inc. organization. Mid-Sioux offers programs, services, and resources to local families that find themselves facing financial or housing emergencies. Their goal is to help lift families and especial children out of poverty and into self-sufficiency.

One of their programs is a food bank that is available to those that need help feeding their families, and our congregation has always been a part of this service by collecting non-perishable food items and household/hygiene items to restock their shelves every spring. The representative that I talked to said that the current economy has been hard on many local families and their food pantry is getting bare.
