Sunday, October 29: Combined Reformation Day Service: Bethel CRC and Bridge of Hope CRC invite you to the annual combined Reformation Day service at 6:00pm at Bethel CRC. Pastor Sam Ashmore will be giving the message, "Take a Seat" based on Psalm 91. An offering will be received for One Body One Hope and a nursery will be provided. Another highlight of the recital is Jehan Alain's *Litanies*; the theme stated at the beginning continues uninterrupted and includes complex harmonies, representing the ascent of faith. Saturday, November 4: Dordt University student Aaron Galloway will present a senior cello recital at 7:30pm in the B.J. Haan Auditorium. The recital features pieces from Baroque to contemporary styles that demonstrate a broad range of what the cello is capable of. The recital begins with an unaccompanied suite for cello by Bach, which is a staple in the repertoire. A short elegy by Jacques Offenbach shows the operatic and lyrical quality of the cello, and a few pieces by Aaron Minsky venture into contemporary, popular styles. The final two works are by Ludwig van Beethoven: a duet for viola and cello, and a sonata for cello and piano. All are welcome to a reception following the recital.
